AEA shortlisted in Financial Times PLC Awards for Achievements in Sustainability

Leading environmental consultancy AEA has been shortlisted for the Financial Times PLC Awards 2009, in the category of achievement in sustainability. AEA is one of four shortlisted companies, who have been recognised for their efforts and contributions to sustainability in the UK corporate landscape.

AEA has been nominated for its work with public and private sector clients, resulting in an annual UK emissions reduction of 3.6m tCO₂. Other achievements have included awards for its waste management and resource efficiency work, as well as being voted top consultancy for climate change and renewables in the 2008 EDIE awards.

The Achievement in Sustainability award was introduced for the first time last year, recognising achievements in the areas of economic, environmental and social sustainability. The company must also have had an important role in addressing wider issues such as climate change or resource management and efficiency.

Other categories in the PLC Awards include Company of the Year, Best Technology, Turnaround of the Year, Best Investor Communications, Entrepreneur of the Year, Best Performing Share and Best Performing Smaller Company Fund.

Winners will be chosen from the results of a public vote and decisions made by a panel of city professionals. Both votes will be equally weighted in reaching a final decision.
